The Texas native has been honored by the Academy of Country Music with awards for both Top New Male Artist and Song of the Year. Jack is known for his positive, high-energy shows that include his original songs along with covers of Texas greats like Guy Clark, Willie Nelson, and Kris Kristofferson.

Jack is as beloved for his solo work as he is for his collaborations, as shown [here on his YouTube page](#). He teamed up twice with actor Matthew McConaughey on concerts to raise money for children's charities, and his most recent album "Ridin' High...again"—recorded in Austin at the famed Arlyn Studios—featured the legendary Charlie Sexton on guitar. Jack co-wrote the 2018 Academy of Country Music's Song of the Year "Tin Man" with Miranda Lambert and Jon Randall Stewart.
